
LABOUR STATISTICS ANNUAL BULLETIN -2021

DECENT WORK INDICATORS

DEPARTMENT OF LABOUR, MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND FOREIGN AFFAIRS

The measurements of Decent work cover primarily the ten basic elements that closely inter-related to the main four pillars of Decent Work Agenda that comes under eighth Sustainable Development Goal.

The timely measuring of decent work indicators by reliable sources will support monitoring the decent work status of the country's economy. It would help the authorities of the Labour Department of Sri Lanka to understand the present level of the decent work agenda, and furnish the legal activities if necessary for the well-being of workers of the country.

In accordance with ILO framework for Decent work indicators, which was presented at the 18th International Conference of Labour Statisticians in December 2008, the second edition of the ILO Manual has given 58 Decent Work statistical indicators under 10 substantive elements. Following the guidelines of this ILO Manual's second version with Currently available sources 26 Decent Work indicators were produced for Sri Lanka.
